Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

One of our former Associate Pastors publicized events as "the best ever" or "a don't miss it" event. We applauded the enthusiasm even though I never remember anyone saying "that was the best ever...I'm glad I didn't miss that!" I am remembering his signature publicity as Lent begins this year on Wednesday, February 26<sup>th</sup>. We will observe Ash Wednesday – so named for the traditional imposition of ashes – at 7:15 pm and ashes will be available for those who wish to receive them.

The traditional approach to Lent is to give up something for which we have an inordinate attachment to "teach the body a lesson", if you will, that it can live without something that is too dear in our mind. In his book Give Up Something BAD for Lent, Pastor and author James W. Moore encourages readers in a different Lenten direction: to give up something bad such as harsh, condemning judgments; enemies; running away; a bad habit; or pettiness. Others have found in Lent an opportunity for taking on a new, healthy habit: physical activity, spiritual reading, communicating with loved ones, serving in a clothing cupboard, or exploring a new form of prayer.

Given our different life phases, personal journeys, and life situations a one-size-Lenten-observance does not fit all. Equally true is that letting Lent slip by unnoticed would be a missed opportunity to know and experience God's love more fully, to be more healthy in mind, body and spirit, or to get out of our comfort zone and serve others.

I cannot promise this will be the "best ever" Lenten focus, but I do believe that our Lenten observances will give the Spirit something with which to work for our ongoing personal transformation. **Worship on Sundays in Lent will focus on The Lord's Prayer** - Matthew 6:5-13 (14).

March 1 – Our Father in Heaven. Hallowed be Your Name

March 8 – Your Kingdom Come, Your Will Be Done on Earth as It Is in Heaven

March 15 – Give Us Today Our Daily Bread

March 22 – Forgive us Our Debts as We Forgive Our Debtors

March 29 – And Deliver Us from Evil

## Lenten Midweek Worship Plan (7:15 pm in Friendship Hall) will focus on Simple Spiritual Practices that Transform Us

February 26 - (Ash Wednesday, No Lenten Supper) – *Self-Examination and Confession*...to surrender my weaknesses and faults to the forgiving love of Christ and intentionally desire and embrace practices that lead to transformation.

March 4 – Rest...to honor God and my human limitations through restful rhythms.

March 11 – Prayer of Lament...to take my complaints, anger, sufferings, frustrations and heartaches to God.

March 18 – Service...to reflect the helping, caring and sharing love of God in the world.

March 25 – Care of the Earth...to honor the Creator by loving, nurturing and stewarding God's creation.

April 1 – *Visio Divina*...to worship God in the beauty of created things.



This year It will be held at Faith United Methodist Church, 261 West Chapel Ridge Rd. on Friday, March 6 at 11:00 AM, chaired by Barbara Amsler of the host church. The church is handicapped accessible.

This service this year was prepared by people in Zimbabwe (formerly Rhodesia), with the theme, "Rise! Take Your Mat ad Walk," based on the Gospel of John 5: 2-9a. The special speaker for the day will be Sandra Matoushaya, a native of Zimbabwe who is the Engagement Coordinator of the Board of the Western PA UMC Conference.

A community choir representing local and Oakmont churches, featuring music written by Zimbabweans, will be under the direction of Wilberta Pickett and accompanied by David Billings, both of the Fox Chapel Presbyterian Church.

Following the service a light luncheon will be served with foods from Zimbabwe, with a suggested donation of \$8. **Reservations are requested for the meal and for free child care. Call 412-828-3197**. Parents are asked to pack children's lunches.

World Day of Prayer is held around the world in over 170 countries, and is attended by Christian men and women of all creeds, Catholic, Orthodox and Protestants of many denominations. It had its roots in 1897 with women's missionary projects, and was formally convened in North America in 1927. The offering of the day will go to serve the needs of women and children in Zimbabwe.
