#### **GATHERING IN FAITH**

Reflection in Preparation for Worship

The Sacrament of Baptism holds a deep reservoir of theological meaning, including dying and rising with Jesus Christ; pardon, cleansing, and renewal; the gift of the Holy Spirit; incorporation into the body of Christ; and a sign of the realm of God. The Reformed tradition [including Presbyterians] understands baptism to be a sign of God's covenant. The water of baptism is linked with the waters of creation, the flood, and the exodus. Baptism thus connects us with God's creative purpose, cleansing power, and redemptive promise from generation to generation. Like circumcision, a sign of God's gracious covenant with Israel, baptism is a sign of God's gracious covenant with the Church. In this new covenant of grace God washes us clean and makes us holy and whole. Baptism also represents God's call to justice and righteousness, rolling down like a mighty stream, and the river of the water of life that flows from God's throne.

### **NOVEMBER TODAY and 17 - Dr. Steven Tuell**

Beginnings: What Genesis 1-2 Says (and Doesn't Say)



After studying at WV Wesleyan College and Princeton Theological Seminary, Rev. Dr. Steven Tuell earned his Ph.D. in Hebrew Bible at Union Theological Seminary in VA. He taught at Erskine College, S.C. (1989-1992) and Randolph-Macon College, VA (1992-2005), receiving numerous awards for teaching excellence. Tuell's particular research interests are biblical prophecy, particularly the book of Ezekiel and the Book of the Twelve, and the biblical literature of the early Persian Period. An ordained elder in The United Methodist Church, he has served churches in PA, NJ, WV and VA. He is a member in full connection of The Western PA Conference of The United Methodist Church, and preaches and teaches frequently throughout the area.
